MELVIN GINSBERG

Missing from his residence, 654 East 105th St. Brooklyn, N.Y. since 5:05 p.m. March 22, 1963. Description: MW 31-5-8-250, heavy build, fair complexion, black hair, brown eyes. When last seen was wearing a brown top coat, grey suit, white shirt, orthopedic brown shoes.

HAS ANYONE SEEN THIS MAN?

The picture and description at the left were compiled by the Missing Persons Bureau of the New York Police Department, and circulated in twenty-seven states.

Melvin Ginsberg was very interested in UFO phenomena and other related subjects. He attended all the monthly meetings of our SAUCER NEWS Discussion and Lecture Committee without fail; and, in fact, he was usually the first to arrive. He failed to respond to the notice for the March meeting, however, and at the next meeting, on April 19th, his father showed up unexpectedly, and told us the startling news that Melvin had disappeared!

Mr. Ginsberg informed us that his son had left the house on March 22nd, with the intention of attempting to secure a job in Albany. New York. He took with him about \$200 of his own money. Melvin has been missing since that day - more than three months ago!
John J. Robinson, Chairman of the

Discussion and Lecture Committee, suggested that people with extrasensory perception might be of help in locating Melvin, and he therefore contacted a friend named Bill Daut. Some of our readers will remember Bill Daut as the guest on the Long John radio show who shook up the panel by reciting the exact license

number of a car in Newark, N. J., about which he knew nothing. This incident is told

on pages 155 to 157 of Long John Nebel's book, "The Way Out World."

Bill Daut is in reality Reverend William Daut, the minister of a spiritualist church in Paterson, N. J. He replied to Mr. Robinson's letter of inquiry by stating: Melvin is safe and has come to no harm. He will let his family know where he is when he can prove himself. He is under the protection of an older man. His decision to leave home was pre-planned. He is doing what he wants to do.

Another psychic, named Irwin Greif, heard about the Ginsberg disappearance and asked for a photograph to psychometrize. His findings were almost exactly the same as those of Reverend Daut, with one exception: Irwin feels that the older person is a man

living in Arizona.

There is a possibility that Melvin Ginsberg, wherever he is, may contact saucer researchers in his area. May we ask all our Newsletter subscribers, - particularly those living in Arizona - to be on the lookout for our missing member!
