SWEDEN SHOWS A WAY I

A New-Age Educational Program for Youth.

In this issue, Topside would like to pay tribute to the work of Mrs. Edith Nicolaisen of Hälsingborg, Sweden, founder of PARTHENON, a space age educational organization aimed at enlightening Scandinavian youth as to the new concepts of science brought about by the arrival of technically superior spacecraft to this planet from other worlds.

Mrs. Nicolaisen, besides maintaining contact and correspondence with UFO groups all over the world, handles most of the work in getting out all the necessary literature and information to further the cause of this educational program and frequently puts in an 18-hour day on the job. And an increasing member of groups have gradually realized how important it is for the continued existence and development of our civilization and culture that we establish contact with our fellow-space beings. There is every indication that they have attained a higher spiritual, intellectual and social level than we have, and, consequently, acquired a greater technical ability.

Today we appeal to the young people who are interested in science to direct all their energy and zealous research to the new sources of energy which have now been discovered, and which do not leave radioactive fall-out to the injury of coming generations. Youth must grasp the four-dimensional space-time structure in order to utilize the cosmic energy for the benefit of all mankind.

It is our hope that the Scandinavian youth will join in this educational work. Future generations will thus be given the opportunity of a harmonic development in a new world where universal brotherly love within a fellowship spanning the whole world has swept away all the present barriers between human beings: national, social and political; different creeds and philosophies, racial prejudices, etc.

RECENT OTTANA SIGHTINGS

To groups such as ours, it is encouraging to see a little more publicity being given to reports of UFO sightings in our local press and the interest being aroused by a number of people who would like to know more about the strange things they are seeing in the skies these days!

On Tuesday, Cctober 20, 1964, "The Ottawa Citizen" printed the following article:

"Vere they aircraft, meteors, or saucers?

A revival of the flying saucer scare, which once kept all eyes glued to night skies over North America, was renewed in Ottawa last night by numerous reports of "mysterious" objects by both ground and airborne observers. RCAF and Dominion Observatory officials today made conflicting identifications of the objects.

An Air Defence Command spokesman said this morning there were several aircraft in the Ottawa area last night about the time the mysterious objects were reported. "Jets flying above 60,000 feet and using their after-burners" the official said. "will give off a brilliant orange light that can appear unusual from the ground."

On the other hand, Dr. J.L. Locke, in charge of stellar physics at the Dominion Observatory, said the objects were more likely to have been of meteoric origin. "Most of the reports we received," Dr. Locke said, "appeared to describe a series of meteors." At the same time no official at the observatory had been able personally to confirm the sightings.

Miss Karen Archer, a Bank of Canada employee, said she witnessed an unidentified object shortly before midnight and was positive that it was neither an aircraft nor a meteor. "The trail seemed to be made up of red, green and yellow sparks," Miss Archer said.

A milot who reported to the control tower at Uplands also confirmed the sighting. He described an object "moving at fantastic speed and leaving a bright orange trail." He said it travelled from north to southeast and was apparently flying "in line astern" of his own aircraft.

Matched 'big cigar'
Roy Russell, a National Defence Department employee at
RCAF Station Rock cliffe, told The Citizen that he and his wife
stopped while driving on Putman Street in New Edinburgh at 11.52
p.m. and spent "at least one minute" observing an odd object
moving in a scuth-southeast direction.

Mr. Russell said the object looked "like a big black cigar and there was flame coming out of the tail section. It seemed as if the tail pipe was full of sparkles and there were three or more windows along the side of the body."

On Wednesday, October 21, The Citizen followed up with this proffered explanation of the sightings:-

"Flying objects remains of satellite
NORAD headquarters in Colorado Springs has tentatively
identified "mysterious objects" sighted over Ottawa Monday night
as the remains of Cosmos 31, a test satellite launched by Russia
last June 6.

A North American Air Defence spokesman advised Ottawa's directorate of information services Tuesday that the local sightings coincided with the forecast natural extinction of Cosmos 31 after 2,161 revolutions of the earth. He said that the main part of the satellite fell over Northeastern United States, but it is thought parts of the tail assembly may have "burned out" as far north as Ottawa.

Reports requested
The NORAD official requests persons who witnessed the event
to report by letter to the Director General of Operations, Canadian Forces Headquarters, Department of National Defence, Ottawa 4,
in order to make available all pertinent information. Witnesses
are asked to give the following points of information: Exact
time, as near as possible, of the sighting, location of person
making the observation; estimate of section of sky where object
appeared; estimate of the elevation or angle of the object in
relation to the observer, number of objects seen.

Topside Investigates
On being interviewed by a Topside reporter, Mr. Roy Russell
stated that he had received a letter from NORAD giving various
details to support their theory that the unidentified object he
had seen was part of the tail assembly of the burned-out Russlan
test satellite, Cosmos 31. However, on carefully working out
speeds and orbits, direction and other data given, Mr. Russell
said they didn't seem to fit in with what he had seen. For one
thing, he was quite certain that the object was travelling in a
south-southeasterly direction and furthermore, it gave every
appearance of being on an upward incline rather than coming down.
His wife, too, had volunteered this impression of an upward course,
unasked. Also, he felt that the object when first seen, was
flying too low horizontally to be the descending part of a satellite, and its later apparent upward course gave him the impression
that it was a "manned craft" of some kind.

Mr. Russell said that his wife had first noticed the object in the sky, exclaiming: "Look - what le it? It's not an airplane, it has no wings!" He said that what they had seen was a long, dark, cigar-shaped object with somewhat irregular yellow and orange

lighted sections. There appeared to be about three dimly lighted windows in the side of the craft, although these might have been metal plates giving off some reflection. The object was flying slowly, silently and at a fairly low altitude over a tall apartment block known as Champlain Towers. When asked about the size of the flying object, Mr. Russell replied that while it was difficult to estimate its size in flight, he imagined that on the ground it would be about "two or three house-lots long."

In summing up, Mr. Russell said he was not convinced that the NORAD explanation fitted in with what he had seen. On being asked what he thought the object really was, Mr. Russell laughed and said: "Well, if I said it was a flying saucer or something of that nature, I suppose some people would think I was crazy." To which our reporter replied: "Yes, some would, but probably not as many as you may think."

Then, on Friday, October 30, The Citizen came out with this headling:

"Another unidentified flying object sighted
Another unidentified flying object has been sighted in the
skies over Ottawa. Two women were walking near the corner of
Edgar and St. Francis Streets Thursday morning when they saw
"this orange crooked triangle with a rough edge on top" in the
southeastern sky.

Mrs. Jocelyn Isaacs of 20 Sycamore Dr. said the object stayed still in the sky, blinking on and off at 30 to 45 second intervals. "It was just as if somebody blew out a candle." she said. Mrs. Isaacs said she and her friend, Mrs. Brenda Mazan of 74 St. Francis Street were so frightened, they ran back to Mrs. Mazan's apartment. "Once we were back, we looked out of the window and it had changed position in the sky." said Mrs. Isaacs. She said the object eventually got so close, "it seemed as if I could reach out and touch it. There weren't any trails, sparkles or glows. This was just a solid whatever it was."

Dr. J.L. Locke, chief of the department of mines and technical surveys stellar physics division, said because the sky was overcast Wednesday night, the phenomenon couldn't have been astronomical.

when Topside interviewed the two ladies mentioned in this report, the following further details came to light.

The object, which was first seen by them at 1.15 a.m., in the southeasterly sky, was bright orange in colour and a lot larger than the full moon in size. It appeared as a solid, roughly triangular shape, with an irregular edge on the left hand side of the triangle, and the whole thing lit up and went out at regular intervals. Mrs. Isaacs stated that when she and her companion ran frightened, back to Mrs. Mazan's apartment,

when they looked from the apartment window, it was then in the due east, its colour was more yellow than orange, and it appeared to have changed its shape into a roughly crescent form. It was much larger in size and seemed to be hovering just at the top of an apartment block about 30 feet high. Asked to estimate its size in relation to the apartment block, Mrs. Isaacs thought it might be about 20 feet long by 12 feet high but admitted it was difficult to estimate, not knowing its exact altitude.

The two ladies watched the object from the window for over half an hour during which time they turned on the radio to see if there were any other reports of the sighting but they heard none. Finally, the object disappeared suddenly.

Mrs. Mazan stated that she had the impression that what they had seen was only the lighted, bottom half of the 'aircraft' and that there was some sort of upper structure to it. "It looked incomplete, the way we saw it." she said. She further stated that she telephoned Uplands Airport but they were unable to trace the lighted object in the sky. Asked if the object had made any noise, she replied no, but rather an odd thing had happened. When the object was at its closest, her radio "went dead" for several seconds.

THE DEATH TRIANGLE AT THE BERMUDAS"

In the course of the past 20 years, about 100 people have disappeared here - without a trace!

New York: "Project Magnet" of the U.S. Navy is attempting to solve an enigma which has puzzled navigation for a century and aeronautics for 20 years - the atmospheric and magnetic conditions in the so-called Bermuda - or Death - Triangle. The Triangle's base is formed by the 1700 kilometer air line (beeline) between Puerto Rico and a point between West Palm Beach and Orlande at the east coast of Florida. By drawing lines on the map from that point and from Puerto Rico to the Bermuda Isles, one obtains a lateral line of 1500 kilometers to the West, and a line of 1550 kilometers to the East. Within this triangle, vessels have been disappearing for 100 years and more recently airplanes, without leaving a trace.

The well-known incident of December 5, 1945 when five Avenger Torpedo Bombers, with a crew of 20, got lost in this space without any wreckage fragments being found, drew the attention of the Pentagon to the Triangle. Involved in this incident also was a Navy flying boat which started on a search and, 20 minutes later, disappeared, giving no news as to the reason.

In January 1948, a passenger plane, with 30 people, was lost, which had started from the Azores for Cuba.

A four-engine plane disappeared in the Bermuda Triangle on January 17, 1949.

In October 1954, it was a U.S. Super-Constellation, with 42 people on board. Although they had two independent radio devices, they gave no SOS either - the same as the other missing machines.

On November 9, 1956, a patrol plane of the U.S. Navy was lost there.

More recent cases concern three planes and two boats. On January 8, 1962, a jet tank plane crossed the Death Triangle on the route from Virginia to the Azores, and did not make it across its borders.

On February 2, 1963, a sulphur tanker, with a crew of 39. .. went down in that space on route from Beaumont (Texas) to Norfolk (Virginia). Weak but inarticulate signals were received from this vessel.

Since July 1, 1963, a fishing steamer, with 40 men aboard, has been missing in the Bermuda Triangle, of which, after a

ten-day search, not even a splinter of wood was found.

In August, two strato-tankers started from Florida on an air tank exercise. They signalled their position before entering the Triangle - never to be heard from again.

The marine register reports from this territory show a great many more boat losses than missing planes. A search through the older volumes disclosed that, for the past 100 years, boats have continuously disappeared there, with no explanation for their sinking.

Since 1945, the Bermuda Death Triangle has claimed over 100 human lives. Not one dead body has ever been found!

All this caused the establishment of "Project Magnet", a mutual enterprise of the U.S. and Canadian Navies, in which a number of planes with sensitive measuring apparatus observed the atmospheric and magnetic conditions of this region.

Already back in 1950, A Canadian Government expert had, during test flights in the Triangle, discovered "layers of reduced atmospheric binding, which, as deviations, influenced compass, radio and electronic apparatus."

The last Canadian-U.S. measurings yielded something unique, viz.,
"... special magnetic forces which do not originate from the ground but
from above" as it was expressed by them. Apparently they result in sudden,
inexplicable catastrophies to planes and vessels which disappear without
trace and cannot be proven any more thereafter.

northerly direction. His first impression was that it must be a satellite, but then it appeared to change course to the south-east. He continued to watch it for another five minutes and then he says "it lost its luminosity gradually, like someone had used a reostat, and was lost to my sight within 3 seconds. The next day I called the local observatory to check if satellites conceivably behaved in such a manner but received a very definite answer in the negative. I had the impression that the object had just started to move when I first looked at it. I could be wrong but I venture the opinion that we are, in all actuality, being watched by our space brothers."
